Section 1510 scholarship has been renamed the Orlando Acevedo scholarship in memory of his countless contributions to Section 1510.

If you or an immediate family member is a full time college student, please read on.

This scholarship is open to all members of Section 1510 and their immediate family (children, spouse, or parents of the member). Scholarships will be provided only for full time students taking a minimum of 12 semester credit hours and pursuing college education in an accredited college or university (matriculated in a college or university).
